Staff Student Consultative Committee



Before

• Consult Students

- Identify Collective Issues
- Add an agenda item (if applicable)
- Read any info/papers circulated
- Check time, date & location
- Send apologies if you are unable to attend

During

- Be attentive, confident & assertive
- Contribute to discussions
- Take Notes
- If unsure, do not be afraid to get further consultation from students

After

- Feedback to students
- Feedback to your School/Dept Rep
- Follow up with staff (if applicable)

Gain the facts so that you can communicate accurately








How to Gather Effective Feedback










- 1. Download and read your Course Rep UUSU resources

- 4. Gather feedback for SSCC (Student Staff Consultative Committee)





How To Send A Message In UUSU Message Centre

- 1. Login in via our <u>single sign-on</u> (the same as you use to access emails, etc.) Top right of screen.
- 2. In Message Centre choose NEW EMAIL
- 3. Choose ADD RECIPIENTS -- you will see lists available to you as a Rep. Tick the check box beside the mailing list you wish to use.
- 4. Click the check box GOOGLE CAMPAIGN and this will display how many people have opened your email.
- 5. Type your message into the text editor (you can add links and photos), then press send.
